## An introduction to publishing ecosystem-related research in international journals

This workshop is aimed at researchers who are comfortable with English but who don't feel confident about submitting their work to international journals.

It is being organized by Bruno Ramamonjisoa (ESSA) and Jeannicq Randrianarisoa (CI) and will be delivered by Dr Julia Jones (senior lecturer at Bangor University). Julia has acted as an associate editor of Conservation Biology and senior and associate editor for the Journal of Applied Ecology and reviews regularly for a wide range of journals including Science and the Proceedings of the National Academy of Science. She will include materials prepared by Dr Martin Fisher (editor of Oryx: the international journal of conservation).

Targeting the right journal (including understanding 'impact factor', the advantages of open access or not)

Ensuring you get sent out for review (getting the right title, abstract and avoiding common errors) Dealing with reviewer's comments
